
### History Exhibition of "Information Fujimino

Fujimino International Cultural Exchange Center (FICEC) was formed in July 1997, and 26 years have passed since then. During these 26 years, FICEC has continued its activities with the goal of creating a community where foreigners and Japanese can live together in affluence.

FICEC's activities include daily life counseling for foreigners, Japanese language classes, international exchange, and international children's clubs, and its multilingual information magazine "Information Fujimino" has been providing information to support foreigners in their daily lives for 26 years.

In the first issue, we published "Living Information" and "Guide to Japanese Language Classes in Two Cities and Two Towns" with illustrations and maps. Since then, we have been providing monthly information deemed necessary for the daily lives of foreign residents, such as "How to Change or Extend Status of Residence," "Holiday Clinics," and "How to Dispose of Garbage." etc.

In November, we will hold an exhibition of history as seen through "Information Fujimino". This is an exhibition about 26 years of "life issues", "support", and "international exchange". Let's have multicultural exchange through the exhibition.

I am Nepalese and I brought my 9 year-old child to Japan. I would like to send my child to elementary school in Japan. What is the procedure? Also, he does not understand Japanese at all. Is there any support program for Japanese language?

First, you will need to register your child at the city office. After that, contact the local board of education to determine the school your child will attend, the grade level, and the first day of school. For Japanese language instruction for your child, consult with the principal, as some schools offer tutoring support depending on the municipality.

Fujimino International Cultural Exchange Center provides Japanese language education and learning support for children with foreign roots every Saturday from 10:00 am. There are also organizations that provide learning support for children in various locations in Saitama Prefecture. You can check them out on the Internet.
